

Herbal and Floral Teas

新疆高山雪菊茶 \$20 serves two

Snow Chrysanthemum - Xinjiang

This 'heavenly' rare flower only grows in the Kunlun Mountains, where the low temperature allows the flowers to mature slowly and acquire more flavor. Contains high amounts of amino acids and proteins; it helps to lower blood sugar, reduce cholesterol, and prevent heart disease. This tea is caffeine-free.





高山玫瑰花茶 \$20 serves two

Mountain Rose- Yunnan

Located at latitude 23° north, these plateau roses enjoy the annual sunshine for more than 270 days, developing into an abundant aromatic fragrance. Brings relaxation and joy to the body and mind, healing pain and discomfort with a sweet, fruity taste. It is brewed with Chinese dates, citrus peel, apple and mums flower. This tea is caffeine-free.

塞外龙井金莲花 \$15 serves one

Jin Lian Hua- Hebei

Named 'Golden Queen' tea, Chinese Globeflower grows in cool climate areas at an altitude of 1,000-2,000 meters. As a medicinal flower, it reduces fever and detoxes, acting as an antibacterial and antiinflammatory. It can help build resistance of upper respiratory tract infections. These flowers are bright, and the tea is sweet-floral with a hint of fresh mint.

Orange Pu Erh-Yunnan

Finely-aged, ripe Pu Erh tea leaves are stuffed inside a naturally-dried green citrus, assembling a perfectly balanced and smooth tea. Sweet orange notes mixes with traditional rich and earthy flavors of Pu Erh leaves. This tea greatly benefits gut health and digestion. Great for adventurous tea drinkers.

Jasmine- Fujian

Jasmine flowers bloom in Fujian province, southeast China. Every summer, premium fresh green tea leaves are layered with jasmine blossom, so that flowers may weave their aroma onto the tea leaves.10 oz of jasmine flowers are used to scent 1 oz of green tea leaves. That is why this fine tea offers the best mix of fresh and floral aroma.





西湖龙井绿茶 \$15 serves one

Long Jing- Hangzhou

Longjing green tea is the highest quality green tea in China, which is renowned for its status as imperial tea since the Qing dynasty. Located at 30°04'~30°20' N, these tea trees grow in the best suitable conditions for tea plants; mild climates and bountiful rainfall help create a rich, refreshing, and fragrant flavor that is unforgettable to every tea lover.

Oolong Tea

福建铁观音茶 \$20 serves two

Tie Guan Yin- Fujian

Grown in Anxi, in Fujian province, Tieguanyin tea is a premium oolong tea that is well-known for its intense and long-lasting aroma. The tea leaves unfurl slowly in boiling water, creating a lush, golden liquid with a touch of spice and fruit. The tea can steep multiple times and is full of antioxidants to fight illness.





鸭屎香单丛岩茶 \$22 serves two

Dan C<u>ong- Chaozhou</u>

Dan Cong is a semi-fermented tea belonging to the almond flavor series. The mother tree now grows at an altitude of 900 meters and is 78 years old. Tightly rolled leaves allow for a long-lasting aftertaste and aroma of honeysuckles that can be steeped many times without losing flavor. The tea is bright and orange in color, containing more than 500 aroma compounds.

武夷大红袍茶 \$20 serves two

Da Hong Pao-Fujian

Wuyi Da Hong Pao tea is one of the most famous and exclusive teas in the world. This wonderful oolong tea is made by taking tea leaves oxidized specifically at 40%. Handpicked from select mature tea trees, this tea provides a silky smooth mouthfeel with a dark, rich flavor and sweet aroma. It has a unique woodsy character and fruity muscatel tones.
