


ZARDETTO 'PRIVATE CUVÉE' BRUT — PROSECCO, ITALY — N.V. 12

Dry, refreshing, and bursting with energy! The bubbles release aromas of pear, apple, and peach. On the palate, it offers a hint of spice and a crisp sensation. A fun and lively Prosecco that's sure to kick off any occasion right.

'GREEK ROSÉ' — KIR-YIANNI 'AKAKIES' | MACEDONIA, GREECE — 2023 16


Made from the native grape Xinomavro, this one sure is Greek to me—and probably to you too! But hey, the producer, Kir-Yianni, has crafted this native varietal into one of the most aromatic and delicious wines around. Its bright wild strawberry notes suggest sweetness, but it finishes completely dry and balanced.


 **PRO-PAGNE** — PROSECCO MEETS CHAMPAGNE + ROTATING SPARKLING 22

Look out—this wine list is on fire! Three half flutes are placed before you. One is Prosecco, one is a rotating sparkling wine from Europe, and the last is the real deal—true Champagne. Your task is to identify all three, and if you succeed, you'll be a *Champ-ion*! You know what they say, 'No 'pagne, no gain!'


'BARBIE SPARKLES' — DOMAINE RONDEAU BUGEY CERDON, FRANCE — N.V. 15

One of the most intriguing wines from France is unapologetically pink, slightly sweet, and bubbly. This wine hails not from a town or even a small village, but from the tiniest of hamlets in the south of France. Typically enjoyed as an aperitif, it also pairs beautifully with our array of Dessert Boards and Crème Brûlée.

 **BOP KIWI BOP!** — A NEW ZEALAND SAUVIGNON BLANC VS. ITS ITALIAN COUSIN 16




The ultra-popular New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc has a new dance challenger. Enter the Tarantella, a fast-paced, traditional Italian dance, and a Savvy B from Northern Italy that moves just as quickly. This pairing is an effort to introduce Kiwi fanatics to the broader spectrum of clean, crisp white wines. The New Zealand love affair runs deep, but even lifelong partners can benefit from learning a few new steps... and maybe flirting with a new elixir.

 **SANCERRE WHERE?** — SANCERRE & A LOIRE VALLEY SAUVIGNON BLANC 18


Two French white wines are placed before you. One hails from the renowned region of Sancerre. This French region has produced sought-after white wines for over a thousand years! But there's a challenger looking to give Sancerre a run for its money: Jacques Dumont's Sauvignon Blanc from just outside Sancerre, in the Loire Valley. Can you identify the true Sancerre? Is the other wine a worthy competitor at half the price?

OVUM 'BIG SALT' — WHITE BLEND | WILLAMETTE VALLEY, OREGON - 2024 15

It's a long drive—or an expensive flight—to get to the ocean, but order a glass of Big Salt and be instantly teleported to the beach. This dry, unoaked wine has a saline or sea spray quality to it. A real vacation in a glass!

 **BLINDED BY THE WHITE** — A LEVEL 5000 SOMMELIER CHALLENGE! 16

Are you ready for the most challenging wine pairing yet? Two exceptional dry white wines from the least likely places are set before you. Can you correctly identify where they're from? And with that... good frekkin' luck! (Note: if you correctly identify their origins blind, we'll call you a Sommelier—and might even ask for your Venmo to send you a reward for your wine wizardry.) Want to make it a 50/50 shot? Just ask your server to reveal the two locations, and then guess which is which.


 **JUDGEMENT OF PARIS: VIN BLANC** — AN AMERICAN WHITE CHALLENGES ITS FRENCH PEER 25

In 1976, wine history got turned upside down. A blind tasting in Paris—later dubbed the Judgement of Paris—pitted American wines against their French counterparts and shocked the world when the results were revealed: in both the red and white categories, the Americans came out on top! VOLCANO WINES! — EVALUATING TWO REDS MADE NEAR ACTIVE VOLCANOS

Wineries love to boast about volcanic soil, but the term is often stretched too far. Here, however, we present two wines that are genuinely rooted in volcanic earth. The first, Los Bermejos, comes from the Canary Islands, where centuries-old eruptions left the island blanketed in lava. Next, we travel to Sicily, where repeated eruptions have created rich volcanic terrain that vines continue to flourish in. Volcano wines provide a tinderbox of enjoyment—typically providing a unique saline-mineral edge to their bright, earthy red fruit profiles.

‘A MASTER SOMMELIER’S RED’ — A ROTATING RED WINE SO GOOD, IT’S MASTER SOMMELIER-APPROVED

Years ago, I was seated with six or more Master Sommeliers for dinner in California. This was quite a high concentration of Master Somms, given that there are only 279 in the world! The moment was tense with anticipation when the server brought over the wine list. What wines do Master Sommeliers order? It turns out they zero in on great wines that are—get this—very inexpensive! So, go ahead and savor this Master Sommelier-approved red currently in rotation.



RUNNING OF THE BULLS — EVALUATING AGE IN SPANISH RIOJAS

Rioja is Spain’s most iconic wine region, known for reds that shine with age. Here, we’re showcasing the two extremes: a younger Crianza and the granddaddy of them all—a 2016 Gran Reserva from Marqués de Riscal. Most restaurants wouldn’t dare serve a Gran Reserva by the glass due to the price, but at Milly’s, you can experience it alongside its increasingly popular younger cousin. So, is the trend of younger Riojas justified, or is Tempranillo simply better with age?



SIBLING RIVALRY — WINES FROM A PORTUGUESE BROTHER & SISTER GO HEAD-TO-HEAD

Lúcia Ferreira makes wine in Portugal’s Dão region. Her brother, Filipe, produces wine just 50 miles away in the neighboring Douro region. Here, we present two of their wines, both of which are red blends comprised of 60% Touriga Nacional. Lúcia’s wine is blended exclusively with Tinta Roriz, while Filipe adds additional Touriga into the mix. Similar on paper, but entirely different in the glass. So whose wine is winning this sibling rivalry, and who is charging more? It’s a real *Family Feud*!



FRATERNAL ZINS — AMERICAN ZINFANDEL VS. ITALIAN PRIMITIVO

Before you are an American Zinfandel and an Italian Primitivo. DNA has verified that Primitivo and Zinfandel are, in fact, the same varietal. But when it comes to taste, the differences are striking. American Zinfandel tends to have brighter fruit tones, while Primitivo typically leans more earthy. Think you can tell which is which?

What a fantastic red wine! Lambrusco is the grape, and refreshment is the game. Served chilled, it’s frizzante (slightly sparkling) and finishes with just the right amount of light sweetness. Embrace this wine!
