The Old Cutler Inn is back and better than ever with the opening of a new restaurant just steps away from the historic Deering Estates. The latest iteration of Snowden's, a well-loved Palmetto Bay local haunt founded in the 1920s, returns with American fusion classics with history rooted in the heart of each dish.

With interiors rooted in timeless charm, the reimaged space is an ode to the neighborhood's historic past. Complete with wood-beamed ceilings,

herringbone floors and plush banquets, the 4,500-square-foot indoor-outdoor dining venue serves a much-needed gap for the area. The result: a place for people to gather, welcoming morning brunchers, afternoon visitors and evening diners.

On the menu, guests can enjoy a curated menu of classics with a modern twist. From wahoo fish dip, a Korean barbecue short rib, flatiron steak frites, handcrafted oven-baked sourdough flatbreads and a rotating selection of desserts to conclude your evening, the restaurant is an ode to deep nostalgia. Pair your meal with the creative craft cocktail menu. Whether sipping from the wine list or cocktails such as the White Pearl lychee martini or High & Hot spicy margarita, the menu offers something for all taste buds.

Led by Drew Dorsey and Benjamin Pascarella, the pair shares that the renovated venue offers an experience rooted in hospitality and history.
